 - Supports and resources for young people with special needs offered at all Family Series Productions

 - Sensory friendly night
 - Free tour ride with reduced audio, caregiver companion pass for Create Your Own Candy Bar, and 4D show is modified into three levels for sensory sensitivities

 - o Play without boundaries
 - Early opening that provides reduced crowds and lighting, along with less noise
 - Quiet kit sensory toys, program room art activities and theater performance
